Secretary of Homeland Security Announces Termination of Temporary Protected Status for Haiti

After reviewing country conditions and consulting with the appropriate U.S. government agencies, Secretary of Homeland Security Kristi Noem has <u>terminated Haiti's designation</u> for Temporary Protected Status (TPS). The Secretary determined that it is contrary to the national interest to allow Haitian nationals (or aliens having no nationality who last habitually resided in Haiti) to remain temporarily in the United States. Haiti's TPS designation and related benefits will terminate on Feb. 3, 2026, at 11:59 p.m.

Where an alien's TPS has expired and he or she has no other lawful status, SAVE will provide a "No Status" response. A SAVE "No Status" response can only be provided by manual third-step verification.

Benefit applicants whose TPS has been terminated may have another lawful basis to remain in the U.S. and may also be employment authorized based on another immigration status or a pending application. SAVE provides point-in-time immigration verification, including any current immigration status and pending applications.

Form I-766, Employment Authorization Documents (EADs) with a category A12 or C19 and an original "Card Expires" date of Feb. 3, 2026; Sept. 2, 2025; Aug. 3, 2025; Aug. 3, 2024; June 30, 2024; Feb. 3, 2023; Dec. 31, 2022; Oct. 4, 2021; Jan. 4, 2021; Jan. 2, 2020; July 22, 2019; Jan. 22, 2018; or July 22, 2017, expire Feb. 3, 2026. Employers must reverify TPS Haiti beneficiaries who presented these EADs before they start work on Feb. 4, 2026.
