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Status Change Report Bi-weekly Data Updates

The [Status Change Report](#) launched in June 2025 is available to agencies as a resource to identify prior SAVE cases for benefit applicants with a Form I-766, Employment Authorization Document (EAD), with category C11 (parole), that was later revoked by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. The report data was last updated on Sept. 9, 2025 and will continue to be updated bi-weekly as new data becomes available.

Generating and Viewing the Report

SAVE Super, Supervisor, General 3 and General 4 Users have the ability to generate and view the report. To generate a report:

1. **Login** to your SAVE account.
2. Navigate to “**Reports**” and select “**Status Change Report.**”
3. Select “**Run Report**” and click “**Generate Report.**”
4. **Save** and **view** your agency’s Status Change Report file. The report includes case number, Alien number and EAD revocation date fields. If your file has no data, no cases were identified.

Key Considerations

- **Alternate Immigration Status:** Applicants whose parole has been terminated may have another lawful basis to remain in the U.S. and may continue to be employment-authorized under a different immigration status, category, or pending application. To obtain current immigration status and employment authorization information for an individual whose parole-based EAD has been terminated, create a new SAVE case.
- **Backdated Revocation Dates:** In some instances, EAD revocation dates may appear backdated. This is due to the USCIS EAD revocation process and does not reflect a delay in SAVE’s reporting.
- **Cuban-Haitian Entrants:** An applicant maintains “Cuban-Haitian Entrant” designation even if their parole is terminated. An agency does not need to re-run a case to determine this designation if they have a prior SAVE response with this designation. Cuban-Haitian Entrant designation pertains to benefit eligibility and is not an immigration status.

SAVE Verification Process

SAVE verifies point-in-time immigration status. When an agency creates a new SAVE case for an individual whose parole has ended or was terminated:

- SAVE will verify any new status and pending applications if an individual has an alternative status or their immigration status has changed.

- If no immigration status or pending applications are found, SAVE will provide a “**No Status**” response at additional verification following manual review.

Agency Guidance

SAVE agencies should follow their internal procedures and guidance to determine benefit eligibility when there are immigration status changes.
