

The purpose of this interview is to verify your compliance with the terms and conditions of your visa status and admission. Please bring with you the following items:

- a. Your passport,
- b. Your Form I-94 (Arrival-Departure Record), and
- c. Any other relevant information that can establish that you are in compliance with the terms and conditions of your visa. *(For example, if you are here on a student visa, you should bring proof of matriculation at a DHS-approved educational institution that includes, but is not limited to, recent report cards, current evidence of class registration and current student identification documents or cards, as well as evidence of residence such as a lease agreement or residential housing statement from your school. If you are here on an employment-based visa, you should bring proof of continued employment that includes, but is not limited to, pay stubs and employee identification documents or cards, as well as proof of residence such as a lease agreement or other household bill in your name, directed to your place of abode.)*

It is important that you keep this appointment and bring this letter with you. Willful failure to comply with this special registration requirement constitutes a failure to maintain your nonimmigrant status, which may subject you to arrest, detention, fines, criminal prosecution, and/or removal from the United States. If you are unable to keep this appointment, you must notify this office immediately at (202) 616-7606.
