DHS Terminates Temporary Protected Status for Haiti

The Department of Homeland Security today posted a <u>Federal Register notice</u> on the termination of Temporary Protected Status for Haiti. After consulting with interagency partners, Secretary Noem concluded that Haiti no longer meets the statutory requirements for TPS. This decision was based on a review conducted by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, input from relevant U.S. government agencies, and an analysis indicating that allowing Haitian nationals to remain temporarily in the United States is inconsistent with U.S. national interests.

The termination of the Haiti Temporary Protected Status designation is effective February 3, 2026. If you are an alien who is currently a beneficiary of TPS for Haiti, you should prepare to depart if you have no other lawful basis for remaining in the United States. You can use the <u>CBP Home mobile application</u> to report your departure from the United States. This secure and convenient self-deportation process includes a complimentary plane ticket, a \$1,000 exit bonus, and potential future opportunities for legal immigration to the United States.
