

Subject: Green Cards Without a Signature Are Acceptable Documents

Permanent Resident Cards that say “signature waived” are [acceptable documents for Form I-9](#), Employment Eligibility Verification, as long as they are unexpired and reasonably appear to be genuine and to relate to the person presenting them.

Since February 2015, USCIS has been waiving the signature requirement for people entering the United States for the first time as lawful permanent residents after obtaining an immigrant visa abroad. [Read news article](#) about this change.
